Being a buddy is a big responsibility! Starting school at Primary 1 can be scary and you want your buddy to feel as comfortable at school as possible.

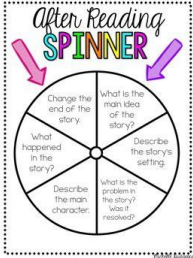
We aren't sure yet if you will have one buddy or lots of buddies so don't worry about not knowing their name.

- Make sure you say hi to your buddy and introduce yourself!
(Be a smiley face that your buddies will recognise when they see you!)
- Tell your buddy about yourself (what's your favourite sport, hobby, animal)
 - What your favourite thing is about school
(Remember you want your buddies to feel safe, not scared!)
- Tell them how much you are looking forward to meeting them 😊

Imaginative Writing Story Title Generating This week you have the chance to come up with different story titles for an imaginative story. Add your story titles to the document 'Writing Story Titles'. You can add as many titles as you like! Next week you will be choosing one of the titles to write your own story – if you want to have a selection of titles to choose from then you better get adding!
