Did you find all of the multiples?

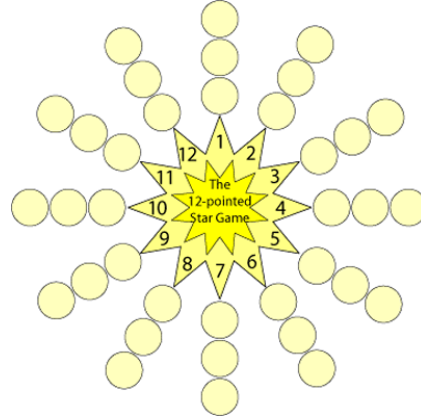
Did you get quicker?

Probability game



Draw the image above.

The game is for two or more players.

Each player chooses one, two or three numbers.

Players then take it in turns to roll two dice and add the scores.

The player who has chosen that number puts a counter on the appropriate circle.

(So for example there's me and my friend Zac. I

choose 2,4 and 6, Zac

chooses 7,8 and 9. Zac rolls the dice and it's a 4 and a 2 - so I can put a counter on 6)

The winner is the first player to have counters on all three circles

Division

Write numbers 1-10 on separate small pieces of paper.

Mix them up and lay them in a pile face down.

Then turn over 2, 3 or 4 of your numbers and write these number down. So if you turn over 3 pieces of paper and you get a 6 a 4 and a 5 = 645

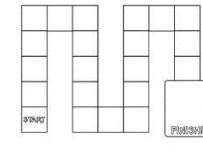
Then divide this number by the next number you turn over e.g. 3
Then do the division sum of $245 \div 3$

Don't forget to show remainders.

After you've finished your sum, put these pieces of paper to the bottom of your pile and play again.

Number bonds

Make up a board game using any template you like or the same as the one below.



In the spaces, write in numbers between 1-100 in any order you like.

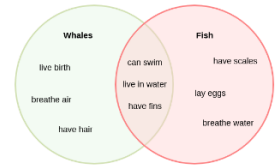
Ask a family member to play with you.

Take turns rolling a dice to move through the board.

When you land on a number, you have got to say what number would be added to it to make 100.

If correct, move 1 space forward, if not, stay where you are (or you can make your own rules for this).
Challenge – can you use number bonds to 1000?

Venn diagram



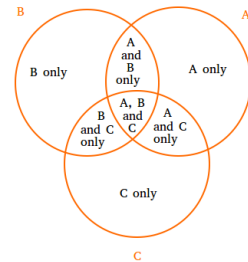
Make up at least 10 questions for you and another family member to answer. e.g favourite colour, eye colour, least favourite food etc.

Then fill in a Venn Diagram showing this information.

Label each of the circles with your names.

Anything that ONLY relates to you would be put in your circle, and anything ONLY relating to them would be put in their circle.

Ask someone to write out words using the spelling rules BUT with some ‘deliberate’ mistakes. Can you find and correct the deliberate mistakes?	Listening Draw a blank cart like this one.  Ask someone at home to read out these instructions below. Listen carefully – can you follow all instructions?	Reading Choose a book and try some of the activities below. 1.Choose some words – write them down and break them up using syllabification (try to find some challenging words) 2.Find 3 synonyms from your book and write 3 other words you could use instead.

		Can you find and correct the deliberate mistakes?	1. The first letter of the car's number plate is the 19th letter of the alphabet. Write this in green. 2. The second letter comes after the second vowel in the alphabet. Write this in red. 3. The third and fourth characters are your age, plus eleven. Write these in black. 4. The final three letters spell a month of the year. Write these in blue. 5. Draw a person sitting in the car wearing a yellow top and a brown hat. Or Ask someone at home to make up their own instructions for things for you to do in the house. How well did you listen to and follow these? 😊	(e.g. said – you could use screamed or whispered) 3. Draw a comic strip of what has happened in your story. 4. Choose some adverbs from your book and write them down. Can you act them out to someone at home and can they guess what they were?
