Anything that ONLY relates to you would be put in your circle, and anything ONLY relating to them would be put in their circle. But, anything that was the same for both of you would

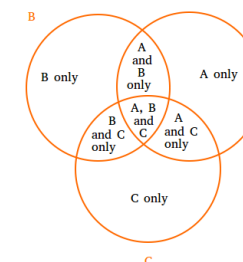
belonging to one of their chosen numbers.

Remember the spelling rules you have been learning in class.

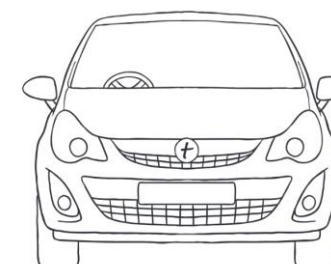
Choose some of the rules you have found most difficult.
